Northridge Hall of Fame Class of 2017

This month we conclude our Hall of Fame articles by featuring **Brian Smith**, Class of 1990.

Certainly Brian Smith had a very active role during his four years in the building. His various leadership positions were many - class president for two years, involved participant in Key Club and Student Council, and Polar Bear Mascot. Brian also participated in NHS track and achieved outstanding times in his different running events; he competed in the Ohio State Track Meet for three years and he was a member of the 1989 State Champion two-mile relay team. In fact, he still holds two NHS records for the 400-meter open and the two-mile relay.

This inductee continues to have high regard and respect for many of his coaches and teachers; his long list of names include **Shanks**, **Hahn**, **Johnston**, **Allen**, **Mikolanis**, **Sheehan**, **Berry**, **Griesmeyer**, Coaches **Smith** and **Szekely**, and many others. "They were people who helped to shape and mold me during my NHS adventure."

Brian's life experiences after NHS were many and varied. He attended Heidelberg College; moved to Utah where he graduated from a Truck Driv-

er's Training Institute. In 2000, Brian moved back to Dayton and became a heavy machinery operator for Moyer Industries where he gained status as a foreman, a superintendent, and then an executive manager. Over the years he created an online chatting site for the physically disabled called Lovebyrd.com, which he later sold. Brian has been a professional vocalist in the Dayton area for 10 years.

Brian launched *The First Heavy Metal Church of Christ* in June 2011 after writing his short story and catalyst for the church, entitled "Christians That Give Jesus a Bad Name." In just five years, Brian's (Continued on Page 2.)


Track: • Freshman Pole Vault record in 1968 (9 foot, 6 inches)

Glen attended Otterbein College after he graduated from NHS where he was a varsity starter on the basketball team for three years. Two of those years he was team captain. He started on 1972-73 Ohio Athletic Conference Championship Team, the school's first in 30 years and played in the Ashland University Holiday All-Tournament Team in 1974.

After graduating from Otterbein College, Glen earned his MBA at the University of Dayton. He has a 28-year banking career, rising to Senior Vice President in the 11th largest bank in the United States. He is a former President of the Dayton Agonis Club and has served 10 years as president of Old Time Newsies Charity benefiting Big Brothers and Big Sisters of Greater Dayton.

In his free time, Mr. Horner is a basketball official. He officiated at the Ohio High School Division I State Final Championship Game in 1995, two NCAA Division III Final Fours, two Mid-American Conference Tournament Semi Finals, and has made two NIT appearances.

Both churches are thriving, as they have baptized over 600 people in the local river. Their church videos are viewed over 100,000 times a year worldwide, and the church has been featured on the Today show and in Vice magazine. Their t-shirts are being worn in over 20 countries worldwide. As Brian says, "We are dedicated to the Northridge area through outreach efforts, including feeding the children at Northland and also providing the Friday night meal for the NHS Polar Bears football team." His church group also hosts other community events, such as, concerts and family fun nights. In January 2016 the group started a pantry known as the Heavy Metal Kitchen that feeds over 100 families every week from the Northridge area

Brian classifies himself as a "Rebel for Christ." His efforts and his church reach out to all-to bring them into the love of Christ and to provide a church home for those that may never have attended a traditional church setting. "I cast my fishing net into all places where most Christians won't go... I love reaching the lost. I credit Jesus for the church's success." Brian's family includes his wife **Rachel** and a daughter, **Darion**, who serves proudly in the U.S. Air Force.
