## The Scholarships

The Northridge Optimist Club has awarded about 200 scholarships to Northridge students over the past thirty two years of holding these golf outing fund raising events. All of the proceeds from the Scholarship Scramble are used for these scholarships and other youth serving projects in the Northridge area. Most of the proceeds are invested in the *Optimist Club of Dayton-Northridge Scholarship Fund*, a component fund of The Dayton Foundation. The Dayton Foundation administers the dispersal of the funds to the scholarship recipients, who are selected by the club's scholarship committee, in conjunction with school counselors. The students are selected based on a combination of academic ability and financial need. Gold, Silver, and Bronze level donors (see page 4 of the program) have scholarships awarded in their name, per the amount of the sponsorship level.

At the Northridge High School awards ceremony in May of 2016, a total of \$13,000 was awarded, divided among thirteen students as a result of the 2015 Northridge Optimist Club Scholarship Scramble. The list of these 2016 recipients is shown on page 8 of the program (along with two additional scholarships totaling \$4800 from money provided for these awards by Cargill Corporation).

Also, a portion of the proceeds are used to fund activities such as the Optimist International sponsored Optimist Essay Contest for students, and our Christmas Sharing program which distributes food to some needy Northridge families during the holidays.

Your sponsorship/donation/participation contributes to the ongoing success of this scholarship program, and the academic success of the students who stand to benefit from the program.
