Financial Obligations: One time initiation fee is \$15.00. Members are billed \$60 quarterly for dues, with a \$10 deduction if the member attends at least one club meeting or function during the previous quarter. The dues cover obligations to Optimist International & Ohio District Optimist, liability insurance, club bulletin, Optimist Magazine, and other miscellaneous costs. The dues fee does not include meals. Meals are charged at \$12 each and only apply to actual lunches attended.

Benefits: Besides the opportunity to help the community and be a "friend of youth", there is the enjoyment of a weekly lunch meeting with an interesting program, various social activities, and most of all, being part of a growing service club organization of people who care! Lasting friendships will be developed with people you may not have otherwise met.

Fundraising

The Northridge Polar Bear Foundation Fund:

With the help of an initial investment by Northridge Optimist Club, this fund was started by Northridge Local Schools with **The Dayton Foundation** for funding school related programs that were not covered by school district budgets. The club continues to donate to this fund on an ongoing basis. The disbursement of funds is



handled as a grant process, with club members serving on an advisory committee that evaluates applications for funds, providing about \$4500 per school year for various educational enhancements. Since the fund's first grants in 2011, a total of over \$50,000 in grants have been awarded to supplement various educational programs.

The "Polar Bear Initiative"

The Polar Bear Initiative is an effort designed to keep providing these programs designed for enriching the educational experience for Northridge students. The last few years have been a challenge for the schools, with the tornado devastation in 2019, and the COVID-19 related setbacks and strains on the budget in 2020, and ongoing. **The Northridge Optimist Club** and **The Dayton Foundation** are seeking donors to help sustain the kind of support that enriches the educational experience for the students. We are reaching out to friends of the Northridge Optimist Club, Northridge alumni, area businesses, and community members to help support these efforts for the coming school year, and beyond.
